

1. Scope of Bid	
The Procuring Entity, <i>BENGUET STATE UNIVERSITY</i> (BSU) wishes to receive Bids for the <b>project: Supply, Delivery,</b> and Installation of Plastinated Human Cadaver and Regional Specimen of Human Brain with identification number IB 2024-28.	
The Procurement Project (referred to herein as "Project") is: IB 2024-28 Supply, Delivery, and Installation of Plastinated Human Cadaver and Regional Specimen of Human Brain BSU La Trinidad Campus, Balili, La Trinidad, Benguet the details of which are described in Section VII (Technical Specifications).	
2. Funding Information

3. Bidding Requirements

The Bidder, by the act of submitting its Bid, shall be deemed to have verified and accepted the general requirements of this Project, including other factors that may affect the cost, duration and execution or implementation of the contract, project, or work and examine all instructions, forms, terms, and project requirements in the Bidding Documents.

For multi-year Framework Agreement, evaluation of the financial proposal during this stage is for purposes of determining eligibility and whether or not such financial proposal is within the ABC.

Similarly, the Bidder may obtain insurance services from any eligible source country.

13. Bid and Payment Currencies	
13.1. For Goods that the Bidder will supply from outside the Philippines, the bid prices may be quoted in the local currency or tradeable currency accepted by the BSP at the discretion of the Bidder. However, for purposes of bid evaluation, Bids denominated in foreign currencies, shall be converted to Philippine currency based on the exchange rate as published in the BSP reference rate bulletin on the day of the bid opening.

#### 18. **Domestic Preference** 18.1. The Procuring Entity will grant a margin of preference for the purpose of comparison of Bids in accordance with Section 43.1.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184. **19. Detailed Evaluation and Comparison of Bids** 19.1. The Procuring BAC shall immediately conduct a detailed evaluation of all Bids rated "passed," using non-discretionary pass/fail criteria. The BAC shall consider the conditions in the evaluation of Bids under Section 32.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184. 19.2. If the Project allows partial bids, bidders may submit a proposal on any of the lots or items, and evaluation will be undertaken on a per lot or item basis, as the case maybe. In this case, the Bid Security as required by ITB Clause 15 shall be submitted for each lot or item separately. 19.3. The descriptions of the lots or items shall be indicated in Section VII (Technical Specifications), 19.3. The ABCs of the sub lots are as follows: although the ABCs of these lots or items are a. Option 3 - One Project having several items, which shall be awarded as separate contracts per item. 19.5. Except for bidders submitting a committed Line of Credit from a Universal or Commercial Bank in lieu of its NFCC computation, all Bids must include the NFCC computation pursuant to Section 23.4.1.4 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184, which must be sufficient for the total of the ABCs for all the lots or items participated in by the prospective Bidder.
