T O : UNIVERSITY PERSONNEL AND STUDENTS

SUBJECT : Strict Compliance to the Municipality Ordinance No. 53, S. 1998

Pursuant to the of Municipality Ordinance No. S.1998, or the Comprehensive Solid Waste Management, all University personnel and students are enjoined to cooperate in complying the following provisions:

- a) Proper and hygienic storage of generated and segregated wastes in receptacles/containers that are provided by the University;
- b) Hazardous wastes from the different departments/units/offices shall be stored safely in good, durable, and duly covered receptacles which should be located in secured and distant site, prior to final collection/disposal;
- c) All Utility Workers, Janitors and other concerned personnel should ensure the cleanliness and orderliness of all buildings, classrooms, facilities, corridors, fronting of buildings, side-walks and streets specially the production areas; i.e., bakery, canteens, processing centers and facilities, etc.;
- d) Hazardous wastes (chemical, biological, and radioactive substances) shall be stored, collected and transported and disposed-off in accordance with applicable laws, guidelines, rules and regulations of the Environment Management Bureau (EMB-DENR), Department of Health (DOH) and Philippine Nuclear Research and Institute (PNR).

All personnel who are occupying cottages within the University vicinity (university-built or individually built) are likewise informed and enjoined to comply with the following Ordinance provisions:

- a) Segregate biodegradable from non-degradable. Segregated recyclables must be properly stored before collection. These recyclables shall be collected separately and brought to materials recovery facility, eco-centers or junk dealers;
- b) Local waste managers are designated in every barangay who shall over-see the collection of recyclables and shall be responsible in coordinating with accredited dealers of manufacturers of recycled products;
- c) Food and kitchen refuse shall be collected as fodder or feeds for animals. Those portions that are not suitable as fodder shall be composed; and

d) Residents shall avoid burning and dumping and adopt recycling, practicing the 4Fs scheme (feed, fermentable, food and fuel which is classified into:

- firewood material-consisting of twigs, branches, leaves, husks, shells, cobs, chaff, sawdust, wood shavings, soiled papers, bagasse, stalks, etc., and
- flammable gas-produced by anaerobic decomposition of all biomass or biodegradable materials in biogas digester.
