Background Information

The Sustainable and Inclusive Peace and Transformation (SIPAT) Program Phase II: Capacity Building and Extension Program is being led by Benguet State University (BSU) and funded by the Office of the Presidential Adviser on Peace, Reconciliation, and Unity (OPAPRU), with support from other collaborating agencies such as the Department of Agriculture–Cordillera Administrative Region (DA-CAR), the DA-Agricultural Training Institute (ATI), Local Government Units (LGUs), the Department of Education (DepEd), the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), and other Cordillera Administrative Region State Universities and Colleges (CARSUCs).

The SIPAT Program Phase II builds upon the accomplishments of SIPAT Phase I and seeks to strengthen the capacity of People's Organizations (POs) and Farmers' Associations (FAs) in conflict-affected and geographically isolated communities in the Cordillera region. It aims to foster peace, reconciliation and inclusive development by empowering local organizations through capability-building, enterprise development and knowledge-sharing initiatives.

In line with this, there is a need to conduct a baseline survey to establish the initial conditions, needs and capacities of the target beneficiaries and communities prior to the implementation of the program's various projects. The results of the survey will serve as benchmarks for future monitoring, evaluation, and impact assessment of the SIPAT capacity building interventions.

Objectives of the Baseline Survey

General Objective: To conduct a comprehensive baseline assessment of the target People's Organizations (POs) and Farmers' Associations (FAs) and their communities to serve as the reference point for capacity development under the SIPAT Phase II Program.

Specific objectives

- 1. To profile the POs and FAs in terms of organizational structure, membership, existing operations and livelihood activities, and institutional challenges;
- **2.** To identify the current technical and organizational capacity levels, and institutional challenges of the organizations;
- 3. To generate baseline socio-demographic, economic, and peacebuilding-related data of member beneficiaries;
- 4. To generate other relevant community and household baseline indicators that may help guide the design, implementation and monitoring of SIPAT Phase II capacity-building activities.

Scope of Work

Role of BSU

- 1. BSU-OPAPRU Project team shall review and approve the proposal to be submitted by the service provider;
- 2. BSU to enter into contract with the service provider to conduct the baseline study;
- 3. Oversee the implementation of the engagement;
- 4. Monitor the progress of the study;
- 5. Review, accept, and approve and endorse for payment of the contract.

Role of OPAPRU

- 1. Provide relevant secondary documents related to the project areas;
- 2. Facilitate links between the service provider, BSU, and the POs and FCAs.
- 3. Endorse BSU and the service provider to the LGUs under which the POs and FCAs are located.

The engaged service provider shall undertake the following tasks:

- 1. Prepare an Inception Report detailing the proposed methodology, survey tools, sampling design, and work plan.
- 2. Conduct field data collection in identified SIPAT communities and municipalities within the Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR) (see Annex 2).
- 3. Administer structured questionnaires, Focus Group Discussions (FGDs), and Key Informant Interviews (KIIs) among SIPAT member beneficiaries and stakeholders.
- 4. Process, encode, and analyze collected quantitative and qualitative data.
- 5. Prepare and submit comprehensive reports and datasets.

EXPECTED OUTPUTS

The Service Provider is expected to deliver the following outputs:

- 1. Inception Report including methodology, instruments, and sampling framework for approval.
- 2. Field Implementation Report detailing sampled areas, respondents, and challenges encountered.
- 3. Cleaned and Validated Dataset in digital format.
- 4. Draft Baseline Survey Report with data analysis, interpretation, and key findings.
- 5. Final Baseline Survey Report incorporating feedback from the BSU program management.

QUALIFICATIONS OF THE SERVICE PROVIDER

- 1. CSO or agency preferably with previous engagement with government agencies or State University and College (SUCs);
- 2. With relevant experience in conducting field surveys, data gathering, and community-based research;
- 3. Demonstrated capacity to manage and supervise field enumerators and data collection activities;
- 4. Lead investigator is preferably a college graduate in Development Communication, Agriculture, Social Sciences, Community Development, or other related fields;

- 5. Lead investigator is fluent or knowledgeable in the local languages within the Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR);
- 6. Lead investigator has the ability to effectively communicate and coordinate within a team setup;
- 7. Lead investigator is keen attention to detail, accuracy and completeness of data;
- 8. Lead investigator must be in good health and capable of traveling to field sites.
