# BSS grads showcase study at PSAI confab, scoops special award

Three Bachelor of Science in Statistics (BSS) graduates of Benguet State University showcased their research papers at the 2023 Philippine Statistical Association, Inc. (PSAI) Annual Conference held in Subic, Pampanga on August 22-24, 2023.

Wijelyn Allan scooped a special award for the Best Student Paper Competition with their research titled "Modelling Rice Pest Incidences using Binomial Logistic Regression." Althea Margaret Celebre and Hannah Grail Lagasi also received recognition for their research papers titled "Factor Analysis on Stress Management Practices of Vegetable Farmers" (co-authored with Charmaine Ryzel Atam and Hanna Rose Kayyang) and "Correspondence Analysis on the Number of In-patients at Benguet General Hospital" (co-authored with Beverly Joy Opiles), respectively.

"I hope that this will inspire our BSS students, especially those making their thesis, to be serious about

their research endeavor as there are opportunities like this that they can join," said College of Numeracy and Applied Sciences Professor Maria Azucena Lubrica who is one of the students' thesis advisers.

Ms. Lagasi also shared that she was awed and inspired by the event, especially that the training, plenary talks, and presentations challenged them as statisticians. "It is not only insightful but also enjoyable as we had fun with our thesis advisers," she added.

Aimed at making better societies through statistics and digital transformation, the event began with a training which included the topics "Leveraging ArcGIS for Data Sharing

and Collaboration" shared by Liz Linda Moraleda; "Data and Analytics for Digital Transformation" discussed by Carmelita Esclanda-Lo; "Data Visualization and Storytelling" by Miguel Molina and Patricia Magnaye; and "Introduction to Crowd-sourcing Data from the Web via R" by Michael Van Supranes.

The second day comprised of plenary talks, parallel sessions, and a fellowship dinner. Another plenary session was held on the third day followed by the awarding ceremonies where the winners of the 2023 Best Student Paper Competition was announced. 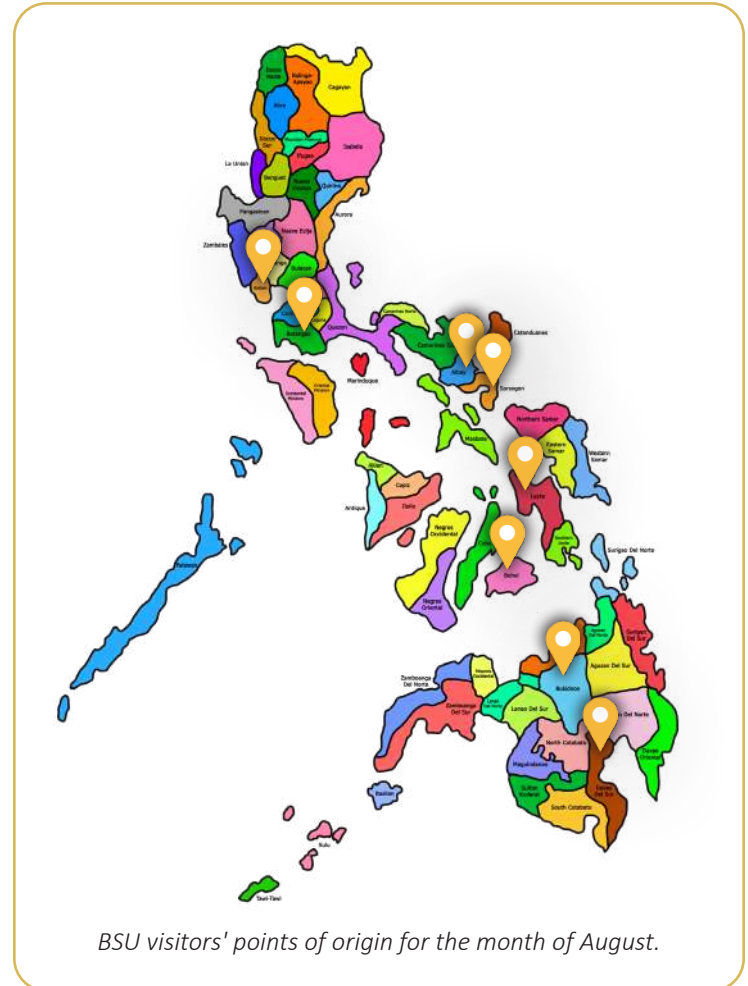

# DOST deploys digitization techs to BSU

**The Department of Science and Technology-Science and Technology Information Institute (DOST-STII) deployed one scanner and one computer to Benguet State University through a project titled "Augmenting and Strengthening the e-Library Services in the Regional R&D Consortia Base Agencies" on August 24, 2023, at the BSU ICT Hall.**

The said project is being implemented by the DOST-STII, funded by the DOST-Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic, and Natural Resources Research and Development (PCAARRD), in which BSU is among the beneficiaries from eight regional consortia base agencies.

It aims to digitize the Agriculture, Aquatic,

and Natural Resources (AANR) knowledge content of the Cordillera Consortium for Agriculture, Aquatic, and Resources Research and Development (CorCAARRD) and other regional consortia-based agencies. It will also be uploaded on the Science Library Integrated Management System (SLIMS), a system

that runs the DOST-PCAARRD eLibrary.

Designed by DOST-STII, SLIM intends to facilitate efficient and prompt dissemination, sharing, exchange, preservation, access, and retrieval of its resources. The said system will be shared among the DOST-PCAARRD regional R&D consortia base agencies.

The activity involved a training and orientation workshop for the personnel from CorCAARRD, led by Consortium Director Dr. Janet B. Pablo, and BSU ULIS staff, led by its Director Lauren P. Kipaam, on the utilization of the SLIMS and digitization process of the AANR resources.//OGDacocot

## BSU Soars in Webometrics World Rankings

**BSU ranked first among Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) in Northern Luzon in the Webometrics World University Rankings published in July 2023. The University also emerged as 32<sup>nd</sup> among 366 HEIs in the Philippines, 2411<sup>th</sup> in Asia, and 5794<sup>th</sup> worldwide.**

The said ranking system is an initiative of the Cybermetrics Lab, a research group belonging to the Consejo Superior de Investigaciones Científicas (CSIC) which is the largest public research body in Spain. The rankings are based on three indicators, including visibility, transparency (or openness), and excellence.

According to Webometrics' website, the original aim of the ranking is to promote academic web presence, supporting the Open Access initiatives for increasing significantly the transfer of scientific and cultural knowledge generated

by the universities to the whole society. The objective is not to evaluate websites, their design or usability or the popularity of their contents according to the number of visits or visitors. A reliable rank is only possible if the web presence is a trustworthy mirror of the university.

The university's consistent dedication to quality in teaching, research, and innovation is highlighted by this remarkable achievement. It serves as an inspiration to the BSU community as it pursues excellence in providing quality education and services among its stakeholders.////OGDacocot

After undergoing the FLAIR Masterclass, the BSU participants are expected to work on QS Stars Rating or QS Asia University Ranking, THE, and WURI to level up the University's international branding in the academic global arena.

In 2020, BSU garnered 3 Stars under the QS Stars Rating System. In the 2023 THE Impact Rankings, BSU gained an overall rank of 1001+ and ranked 201-300 in the 2023 WURI ranking.// ASantiago & RFatog
