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BSU gains highest ARTA rating among SUCs

Benguet State University's commitment to public service was recognized by the Anti-Red Tape Authority (ARTA) during the 2024 Batch Report Card Survey (RCS) 2.0 – 1st Cycle Implementation Awards held on October 23, 2025 at the Conrad Manila Hotel in Pasay City.

The Anti-Red Tape Award is conferred upon government agencies that exemplify efficiency, transparency, and accountability in the delivery of public services. This recognition highlights BSU's successful implementation of ARTA's standards and its steadfast adherence to the principles of good governance.

BSU achieved a 29.50 percent institutionalization rating under Republic Act No. 11032, otherwise known as the Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Service Delivery Act, an overall survey score of 62.84 percent, and four percent external recognition for garnering two international and one national awards. These accomplishments resulted in an overall score of 96.34%, earning BSU a descriptive rating of "Excellent."

Representing the University in receiving the certificate and monetary award were University President Kenneth A. Laruan, VP for Business Affairs Josel M. Florentin, VP

for Research and Extension Roscinto Ian C. Lumbres, Supervising Administrative Officer and OIC–Chief Administrative Officer for Administrative Services Raymundo H. Pawid Jr., and Planning and Development Office Director Allan C. Sacpa.

In his acceptance speech, President Laruan expressed profound gratitude to BSU's collective effort and dedication.

"This recognition is not only for the Administrative Council, Executive Council, and Management Committee—it is for the dedicated men and women of BSU. It represents our shared commitment to

Benguet State University (BSU) joined the Benguet Teachers' Day culmination program at the Benguet Sports Complex on October 17, 2025. BSU personnel joined fellow educators, local officials, and community members who gathered to honor teachers and their invaluable contributions. The program also reaffirmed the role of teachers to nation-building.

The program opened with an inspiring message from Department of Education (DepEd) -CAR Regional Director Estela L. Cariño, who underscored the indispensable role of teachers in shaping learners and communities. She encouraged continuous recognition and appreciation for educators—not only on Teachers' Day but every day—setting a tone of gratitude and respect for the rest of the celebration.

A financial literacy lecture by Jake T. Altiyen followed, focusing on the importance of safeguarding teachers' financial well-

being. He cautioned attendees about the rise of fraudulent schemes and online gambling and urged them to remain vigilant, practice wise financial management, and rely on credible sources for financial information.

In a significant development, Benguet Governor Dr. Melchor D. Diclas announced plans to propose an ordinance granting free master's degrees for DepEd teachers. The initiative aims to support professional development, enhance teaching quality, and expand career advancement opportunities—reflecting the province's strong commitment to empowering its educators.

The program honored the Top 14 Feature Story Writers out of more than 40 entries submitted from across the province of Benguet. Notably, three finalists came from BSU's College of Teacher Education—Martes Dionisio, Johna Belardo, and Imelda Parcasio.

In her closing remarks, Vice

Governor Marie Rose Fongwan expressed heartfelt gratitude to teachers for their dedication and service. She emphasized the importance of unity among educators and stakeholders in advancing the province's educational goals and sustaining its tradition of excellence.

The day also featured indigenous games where BSU faculty members Dona Kalibangan and Martes Dionisio participated.

The Culminating Program for Benguet Teachers' Day stood as a meaningful tribute to the teaching community—celebrating their hard work, reaffirming their role as pillars of education, and strengthening the shared commitment to quality learning, cultural preservation, and professional growth. BSU kicks off 2nd UBA Week

The University Business Affairs (UBA) sector launched its 2nd UBA Week on October 27, 2025, at the RSDC Hall, under the theme "Innovate, Collaborate, and Grow: Unlocking SUC's Potential Through Sustainable Income-Generating Projects."

Director of Business Operations and Business Development Services Rashid B. Lokines delivered the opening remarks, acknowledging officials, employees, and guests while providing an event overview.

University President Kenneth A. Laruan followed, emphasizing the vital role of Income-Generating Projects (IGPs). "IGPs are more than just sources of additional funds; they are instruments for the growth and development of our university, providing support for academic, research, extension, and administrative activities while serving as training grounds for students and sources of income for our community partners," he stated. Laruan thanked partners and urged continued support for the university's growth and community development.

The kickoff included a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the trade fair at the CAS-Annex Lawn, led by VP for Research and Extension

Roscinto Ian C. Lumbres, Lokines, and Betag Barangay Captain Monalisa D. Comila. The fair, held until October 30, showcased products from university partners.

The day's activities continued with a seminar on Disaster Risk Reduction Management (DRRM) and Values Restoration, attended by staff from various IGPs. Security Services Office Director Odolon C. Dulay presented DRRM principles, safety measures for work and home, and demonstrated the "duck, cover, and hold" technique for earthquakes. Rev. Matias C. Angiwan Jr. then discussed Values Restoration, focusing on workplace ethics, characteristics, morals, and values for a productive environment. Speakers received certificates and tokens.

UBA also hosted the two-day IGP Summit on October 28 to 29, 2025 at the College of Home Economics and Technology Function Hall and Strawberry Hall, RSDC Building. The event was attended by heads and VPs from state universities including Bataan Peninsula State University, Tarlac State University, Nueva Ecija University of Science and Technology, Abra State

Institute of Science and Technology, Tarlac Agricultural University, Nueva Vizcaya State University, Don Mariano Marcos Memorial State University, Bulacan State University, Kalinga State University, University of Northern Philippines, Isabela State University, and Quirino State University.

Day 1 featured lectures on IGPs and procurement. BSU Chief Accountant Imelda B. Galinato discussed financial sustainability, challenges, and solutions for SUC IGPs. Finance Chief Andres Arnold W. Lampacan covered procurement challenges, taxation types, and SUC concerns. Darlyn D. Tagarino shared IGP planning strategies, followed by a five-part workshop led by her husband, Leopoldo N. Tagarino.

"I challenge UBA to not just focus on [selling] products... but also the knowledge we generate," she expressed. The day ended with entrepreneur Michael del Rosario's inspiring talk on his journey from humble beginnings to business success.

Day 2 emphasized best practices sharing among SUC representatives, highlighting successful projects and ideas to foster improvement. An open forum followed, enabling questions, insights, and discussions on collaborations.//

Benguet State University (BSU) partners from the Thailand Ministry of Higher Education, Science, Research, and Innovation (MHESI), Maejo University, University of Phayao, and Mae Fah Luang University arrived at the University for a two-day formal visit.

On October 16, 2025, the Thai guests were welcomed by the Office of the University President represented by Executive Assistant IV Maridel P. Langbis and the Municipality of La Trinidad represented by Administrator Franco Bawang Jr.

Langbis delivered an inspiring message on the importance of global collaboration in advancing innovation, entrepreneurship, and sustainable growth. She also shared BSU's 2025–2030 strategic direction, which focuses on transformative education, innovative research, inclusive extension services, and cultural and environmental stewardship. Likewise, Bawang presented the vision of "Limitless La Trinidad" that encourages constituents to harness creativity and technology to drive community progress.

The Thai partners thanked BSU for the warm welcome emphasizing that 'Innovation does not begin in cooperation alone but in being genuine.'

To symbolize the friendship and

A presentation of the Thai partners' various innovations was held on October 17, 2025. VP for Research and Extension Roscinto Ian C. Lumbres delivered the opening remarks highlighting the role of research collaboration in driving community-based growth.

Speakers from Thailand's leading institutions —MHESI, Maejo University, University of Phayao, and Mae Fah Luang University — shared their expertise in agricultural technology, sustainable development, and innovation management.

Plan and Policy Analyst, Senior Professional Level Division of Science, Sombat Somsak of MHESI presented Thailand's Regional Science Parks and Incubation Ecosystem. Following this, Director of Maejo Agro -Food Park Kal Kalayanamitra, of Maejo University

discussed the Maejo Agro-Food Innovation along with the Deputy Director of Maejo Agro-Food Park Panomporn Chalermwan, who also presented their university's Marketing processes. Director of Innovation and Technology Transfer Institute Santiwat Pithakpol of the University of Phayao, presented their university's Business Incubation Models from Agriculture to Social Enterprise; and Director of Mae Fah Luang, University of Science Park Chalida Thaninkullaporn, presented their university's Beauty Valley.
